- 6. Penalty A person who violates this act commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to any a fine of not more than \$100 for the first offense, \$200 for the second offense and \$300 for the third offense.
- 7. Effective Date The resolution shall require a minimum notice of 48 hours prior to the imposition of a temporary countywide burn ban.
